

#### **BUDDING SCIENTISTS**

Here's an easy and fun science experiment that's great for helping kids learn about water bottle fountains. Water can certainly move in mysterious ways.

Our budding scientists explored about how water fountains work by using the air pressure to make the water flow. The water in the bottle has air pressure pushing on it. When the balloon is released, the air pressure on top of the water increases. This increased pressure forces the water out of the straw and creates the balloon water fountain.

At GDGGS we start learning foreign languages from Grade 3.





















#### **Introduction to Media**
